After years of hard work and determination to get the best for Mile End, your ward councillors are delighted that construction has commenced.

Your councillors recently visited the site and development is progressing well and is on schedule to be handed over to Colchester Borough Council in early May 2020.

Both the new rugby club and sports centre buildings are taking shape with the cycle track and other ground works in place.

The all weather 4G pitches are being laid and the grass pitches are complete and looking green and in great condition. We are due to visit again in late autumn and will provide further updates and pictures of this great facility.

The Southern Gateway site for leisure facilities (opposite David Lloyd and at the back of the stadium) has planning permission and is marked for a cinema, hotel, indoor climbing and restaurants.

SUCCESS FOR OUR CAMPAIGN FOR A NEW CROSSING IN NORTHERN APPROACH ROAD

We are pleased to say that the crossing we campaigned for on the Northern Approach Road from the Wallace Road junction has been approved and funded via the Local Highways Panel.

This will make a significant difference to the road safety of those using the area as well as making it easier for drivers to exit and enter Wallace Road from the Northern Approach Road by further regulating traffic flow. The traffic regulation orders for the crossing are currently being advertised. The crossing will still be some time away from implementation, but the good news is it will happen without question.

Martin Goss said "This is good news for those crossing to Queen Boudica School and also for local residents who use that way to walk to Highwoods Country Park and other local amenities such as Asda. We will publish detailed timelines once we know them."

School places advice and Secondary School update

If you're applying for a secondary school place please ensure you put down 6 choices and visit all schools. It will affect any appeal if you don't.

Trinity School is progressing. Essex Council Council have agreed the ground earth works. There's still detailed design going with the acoustic fence and decibel levels. A fresh report has been submitted by Mersea Homes to Essex County Council giving further detailed design.

Gilberd School is moving forwards with the Admission criteria for the new school. Expect to see a draft end of the year - it's likely to be a simplified version of the Gilberd one i.e. No music scholarship.

School opening date is still September 2021.

As we have reported previously the hospital is undergoing significant investment and change.

There is a new cancer centre nearing completion which will help improve the services offered locally. The front of the hospital is also completely changing with a new reception, A&E and integration of the walk-in-centre.

There will also be new retail facilities included with a new M&S food store and Costa coffee shop.

The shop and vital services offered by the Hospital League of Friends remains.

Martin was invited to meet with Chief Executive Nick Hulme to tour the Cancer unit whilst it was under construction and in-fact he visited before our MP was even invited!

Martin has been visiting and representing your concerns with staff at Colchester Hospital for many more years than the Conservative MP has lived in Colchester.

We are fed up...

As you may recall Essex County Council were supposed to be delivering traffic calming for Mill Road in the Thomas Wakley area.

They are still working on trying to engineer a solution to allow for the delivery of a scheme in that area to try and only have local traffic using the road and to push the main traffic along Axial Way and VUR. *Essex County Council will be writing to local residents in Mill Road in due course with an update.*

Residents also fed back to the idea of trialling a 20mph limit on Mill Road from Brinkley Grove Road to the NAR. From the residents who responded over 60% were in favour. Essex County Council are considering this.

We have also requested that a mini roundabout at Bedford Road is considered to help with the flow of local traffic which will also help with traffic calming and speed control.

Enforcement Notice Issued at Northfields

Following a long battle to get the development to a completed state, Colchester Borough Council have issued an enforcement notice against Linden Homes to ensure they comply with planning permission regarding the landscaping on the site. They need to submit fresh plans and get agreement with Colchester on the work required to complete the landscaping so it can be adopted. This covers all landscaped areas and both open spaces.

Failure to comply will mean they will be taken to court in due course.

site towards the middle of the site and there will be a healthcare centre built at the rear of the site which will offer a range of onsite residential age related health facilities.

There's also discussions as to what happens with the existing Rugby Club community building on the site.

We have ensured that no traffic will be dispensed onto Mill Road for the future housing and the health centre and all entry and exit for the facilities will be from Axial Way.

Development of the housing is likely to be 2020 once all planning permission has been granted.
