Revised planning permission has been given for the 'Turnstone' development.

Progress has been slowed by the pandemic. But work continues towards the design and delivery of a **new leisure and** entertainment centre, to bring a **12-screen** cinema. restaurants. bowling alley, hotel, indoor golf and climbing centre right by the Community Football Stadium. Another great facility nearby!

It is great that the Northern Gateway development will benefit from a local power grid using natural renewable energy from underground sources to provide heating and hot water for the whole area, and an integral digital network providing ultra-fast broadband to the new local homes and businesses.

Trinity School LATEST

The new Trinity School for Chesterwell is running late.

We know delay and disruption is a worry and have been working closely with the Gilberd and Trinity Schools to reduce the impact and to keep parents up to date.

David and Martin have pressed the Department for Education hard to minimise the delays and to keep parents informed.

GOOD NEWS

We have been assured the new school will have to happen for September 2023. David will update when we have more news.

Northern Approach Road Bus Lane

Following resident feedback and our intervention changes have been made to plans for the bus lane along the NAR.

Some amendments have been made to fence alignment along with some further enhancements to landscaping.

Development of the lane will take 12 months and will likely commence in early 2022.

Rosewood

Work continues by Crest Nicholson to get road remedials completed. One of the biggest hold ups was the main drainage in the Via Urbis Romanae not being adopted - this has now happened allowing for drainage adoption to start to move forwards on all newly built estates that feed into the main drainage.

Crest have also confirmed they will resign residential director positions on the management company HML and interested residents can then be appointed.

Northfields

Remedial works at Northfields are moving forwards with a view all will be completed by the end of December 2021. Works have cost over £100k.

A yellow lines parking scheme will also be worked up and consulted on to help improve the numerous poor parking especially on junctions.

Mill Road youth shelter

Due to anti social behaviour at the Mill Road youth shelter, which has included the smoking and dealing of drugs and late night noise, the sides to the shelter have been removed to help discourage this behaviour.

The situation will be closely monitored and the police are aware of the issues.

Chesterwell latest

We welcome more residents as they move in - many already who live in Colchester.

Following complaints from residents we have now managed to get management company SDL removed. PMS will take over most of their areas and responsibilities. Handover is in progress.

Countryside Properties now have planning permission for their next phase of the site which is the land behind Boxted Road. We managed to get some changes made to the original plan following concerns raised by local residents.

The new Coop store build is well underway and will be open for December. The Coop store on Nayland Road is safe.

Kingswood Heath latest

Again welcoming new residents, again many local, development of the site nears completion and all houses should be completed by May 2022, if not sooner.

Discussions are now moving forwards on the new Community Centre which will be sited near Camulos Academy.

The new Coop store and nursery has been slowed down by land transfer issues which are now resolved and the latest start date mooted is February 2022. It will be the Manchester Coop as opposed to East of England Coop.

The final playground and basket-ball area should open by end of November 2021.

School parking enforcement

Visits have been undertaken by your local Cllrs along with PSCO Dan Ling to look at school parking issues at Queen Boudica, Camulos Academy and **Myland Primary.**

One parking ticket was issued by a parking warden and lots of advice issued to those parked in a manner considered to be illegal e.g. pavement parking or by a junction.

Visits and enforcement will continue.

Mill Road former **Rugby Club site latest**



New development at the former Rugby Club site now has planning permission.

The development will include 350 family homes with some affordable housing, a generational healthcare campus for older Development is likely to start in 2022.

people, a 20-bed private acute surgical hospital and new medical centre that could accommodate local GPs.

The former rugby club building will be demolished to become a new £1.8 million community centre and will be called St Mark's run by a church. There will also be 12 acres of open space at the Mill Road end of the site,

Access for the main site will be from Axial Way and only access to the community centre will be from Mill Road as it is now.
